Director's Cut: Trauma System Integration

As CentraCare Health (CCH) grows, we are continuously improving the quality and consistency of patient care. The vision for the integration of Trauma Services is to develop a uniform approach within our health system to

provide consistent, high-quality care to injured patients. We are excited to work with the trauma program managers at each site to develop guidelines of care for patients requiring diversion or immediate transfer to a higher level of care, or for the less injured who will receive care locally.

Over the past year, we have integrated and centralized data collection, abstraction, and registry submissions at all CCH sites. In January 2018 Carris Health (a partnership of Rice Memorial Hospital, ACMC Health and CentraCare Health) joined us. This allows each site's trauma program manager to focus on performance improvement and other aspects of their trauma program, while still meeting the state standards for registry data submission. It also allows us to provide benchmarking reports to these sites.

Verified as a Level 2 Trauma Center by the American College of Surgeons (ACS), St. Cloud Hospital is required to participate in outreach education. We currently offer sitespecific case reviews and provide educational opportunities to central Minnesota facilities. Our goal is to further develop educational content for the CCH regional sites, Carris Health and St. Cloud Hospital as determined by our integrated data collection and our performance improvement and benchmarking reports. We believe this will help ensure staff at all sites are trained to deliver the same high-quality care to trauma patients in all CCH and Carris Health facilities.

Another area of focus is injury prevention. Like outreach education, it also is a requirement of the ACS and the State of Minnesota for Trauma Centers included in the statewide trauma system to participate in injury prevention. As we integrate our data collection, we will be able to work with each facility to focus injury prevention strategies in their community.

The final area of focus is process improvement (PI). PI is a significant component in the State Trauma System and with the integration efforts, we can enhance process improvement opportunities. We are excited to begin quarterly system PI meetings and hope to offer CME and CEU's for attendance. We are confident that shared PI will benefit all sites' trauma programs.

As we embark on the journey of integration, we look forward to exploring all the opportunities we have to create a collaborative and strong trauma system.
